### E. One Stop Operator

- Lili presented on Job Link's Youth Job Fair held on September 22. There were 16
   exhibitors and about 100 participants. Survey results will be shared in the next WIB
   meeting. Scott Kincaid shared that he heard about the Job Fair from his school's parent
   application and that it was well presented.
- She is reviewing the Continuous Improvement Plan for the AJCC and is updating a partner directory to share with steering committee partners.
- Lili is providing outreach to the Fijian community about Job Link and services.
- Brandy wanted to know if the Job Link brochure could be provided to Goodwill to have in their lobby.

### F. Grant Updates

- Pru provided updates on the RERP, noting that Business Services is working with SRJC ECE program to setup OJT/TWEX at various childcare sites.
- Prison to Employment (P2E) will work with anyone that has been Justice involved.
- The QUEST grant is allowing Sonoma Family Meals to train dislocated workers in meal
   prep and catering. Stephen mentioned a couple of schools that have ECE programs slated

for next year and will reach out to Pru after the meeting to share contact information for these programs.

 Michelle shared that the Student Training & Education Program (STEP) grant has been submitted in partnership with Department of Rehabilitation. The WIB will hear if they got funded by the end of October.

## G. DEIB Planning

Stephen shared that the next meeting should be coming up towards the end of this month. Goals around membership has been passed to Membership Ad Hoc committee. Michelle mentioned learning and accountability measures as next steps identified by the group. Brandy said that she would like to support the additional training for the WIB.
